This short faculty led study abroad course offers Oregon State University students a practical interdisciplinary opportunity to study Canadian history, social, political, economic, and cultural values. The highlight of this intensive study abroad class will be living in Canada for seven days and being able to observe, listen, and talk to Canadians about their life. Students will be exposed to an active daily program of study, which will include lectures from Canadian scholars, visits to government and non-government organizations, art galleries, museums, and other sites of historical and cultural interest.

By the end of this class, students will gain a comparative, critical perspective on the United States.
